PUBLIC NOTICE

REGARDING A PROPOSED EXPENDITURE

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given pursuant to subsection 169(6) of *The Municipal Act* that the Council of Town of Niverville has scheduled a public hearing at the Niverville Heritage Centre on the 19th day of July, 2016 at 7:10 p.m. Council will hear any potential taxpayer who wishes to make a representation, ask questions, or register an objection to the proposed expenditure described below:

Council proposes to spend a total of \$16,500,000 on building of the Niverville Multiplex. Of this \$16,500,000 the Town will put forward \$ 5,000,000 towards building of the Multiplex. The Town has \$500,000 set aside in reserve for this project and wishes to borrow the remaining \$4,500,000.00 at an estimated interest rate of 6% over 25 years. The annual debt repayment of \$352,020.23 will come from cancellation of current Recreation Facility levy to be renamed Multiplex Levy and future Federal Gas Tax Grant revenues.

The remaining \$11,500,000 is expected from various levels of Government (\$4,000,000 Federal and \$4,000,000 Provincial) and through Corporate, Agricultural and Residential donations from both Niverville and the surrounding areas (\$3,500,000).

Copies of the financial information related to the proposed expenditure are available for review and may be examined by any potential taxpayer during the regular office hours of the Municipal Office at 86 Main Street, Niverville, MB.

Reminder to Residents regarding Drainage—Bylaw 628-05

Subsection 3.4 Roof Downspouts

All building roof downspouts shall be located such that effective positive drainage away from the building is achieved. All downspouts shall discharge through a suitable elbow onto a splash pad, a flip-up roof downspout or by an equivalent method approved by the Designated Officer.

Building roof downspouts shall not be located nor directed so as to cause storm water to drain directly to adjacent property or public sidewalks, stairs or neighbouring property and shall be conveyed so as not to cause dampness in the walls, ceilings, or floors at any portion of the building itself or any adjacent building.

Subsection 3.5 Sump Pump Discharge Pipe

All sump pump discharge pipes discharging weeping tile water shall be located such that effective positive drainage away from the building is achieved. These sump pump discharge pipes shall be fitted with a suitable elbow and shall discharge onto a splash pad or by an equivalent method approved by the Designated Officer, and **shall not** be located nor directed so as to cause discharge water to drain directly

- ◆ onto adjacent property unless a drainage swale is provided as in lane-less subdivisions, or
- ◆ onto a municipal road.

Please note that the 2016 property tax bills have been mailed. If you have not received your bill, please contact the Town office at 204-388-4600 ext. 101 or stop by the office at 86 Main Street.

New property owners are reminded that they are responsible for payment of their 2016 property taxes whether or not they have received a tax notice in their name. Current taxes are payable at par (without penalty) on or before September 30, 2016, by 5 p.m.
