Precautionary Boil Water Advisory

On Tuesday, **January 24th**, the Town of Niverville will be installing a new fire suppression pump and related plumbing in the water treatment plant, as part of the water line installation and water treatment plant upgrades project that began this summer. As a result, those properties hooked up to Town water will be without water between the hours of **9 a.m.—12 p.m.** We do apologize in advance for this inconvenience.

Provincial regulations state that any time a public water system's pressure has the opportunity to drop below 20 PSI (this occasion warrants this advisory because the entire system will be shut down), the Town is required by law to put out a precautionary boil water advisory.

Please know that the Town's system *is in no way compromised*, this is strictly precautionary and following Provincial protocol.

Winter Reminder from Niverville's Parking Bylaw 656-07

"Snow Regulations"

Article 6 - Street Parking Ban

Section 6.1

Persons shall remove parked vehicles and refrain from parking on public streets and lanes during and after snowfall events which will require the removal of accumulated snow. Persons may resume parking on streets after snow removal operations have been completed.

Section 6.2

No person shall deposit snow from private properties onto public roads, streets, lanes and ditches. Persons found depositing snow on public roads, streets, lanes and ditches may be charged the cost to remove such snow.
